How to import goods from Morocco?

Morocco applies the Harmonised Customs System. For free imports, the importer must sign a commitment for imports on form "Commitment for Import, Import license, Preliminary Import Declaration" (in French). trade description of the goods. The Commitment to Import must be filed with an authorised bank chosen by the importer for domiciliation.

An "import commitment," which is the authorization provided by the Foreign Exchange Office for transfer of foreign currencies from Morocco to foreign suppliers abroad. A "customs declaration" (declaration de douane) provided by the Customs Administration, which is required for import and export

through a port or airport.

How are customs duties calculated in Morocco?

Customs duties serve as a primary means for the Moroccan government to oversee and control trade flows, ensuring that all relevant regulations and standards are met. These duties are calculated based on the value of the goods, their classification under the Harmonized System, and their country of origin.

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
