Does Nauru have a radio station?

Nauru has one government-owned radio station and two television stations, one of which is government owned. The island has telephone service under country code 674. The island's Internet service is provided by CenPacNet and Digicel Nauru. The country's ccTLD is .nr. In 1994, there were 2,000 telephone land lines in use.

How will telecommunications cable land in Nauru?

The groundbreaking ceremony signals the start of construction needed to land the telecommunications cable in Nauru, including the installation of a beach manhole, duct work and foundational structures for the upcoming cable landing station.

How many TV stations are there in Nauru?

There are two television stations. One station is government-owned Nauru Television and mainly rebroadcasts British Broadcasting Corporation, the Australian Broadcasting Corporation and Television New Zealand, while the other is a private sports network. Does Nauru have telephone service?

The island has telephone service under country code 674. The island's Internet service is provided by CenPacNet and Digicel Nauru. The country's ccTLD is .nr. In 1994, there were 2,000 telephone land lines in use. There were

450 mobile cellular phones in use at the time.

Does Nauru use Starlink?

However, Nauru has negotiated with Starlink to reduce that monthly payment. Since Nauru committed to the Starlink service, neighbouring Solomon Islands have also issued Starlink a licence to operate there after two years of discussions. Starlink is also used in Tonga and Kiribati.
