After all, type A and B plugs are supposed to be connected to power outlets that supply between 100 and 127 volts and wall sockets in Thailand operate at 230 volts. This means that imported appliances, equipped with type A or B plugs, require a voltage between 100 and 127 V and will be damaged (or.

What is a Thai power outlet?

Our guide on "local things to do in Bangkok" will help you pack the right travel necessities for your trip. A typical Thailand power outlet includes 2 slots with a grounding hole. Thailand voltage is 220 Volts at 50Hz. But what does it mean?

It means any device with the below plugs will fit in most Thai electrical outlets:.

What do Thailand's electrical outlets look like?

When you are going on a trip to Thailand, be sure to pack the appropriate travel plug adapter that fits the local sockets. But what do those electrical outlets look like?

In Thailand, types C and O are the official standards. American type A & B plugs can also be used, but their compatibility is going to be phased out in the long term.

Do I need a power plug adapter in Thailand?

Since your devices voltages are similar to those in Thailand, you only need to worry about the plug adapter. Notice: If your power plug only has 2 pins (doesn't require a grounding hole), it still can be used if you force the head hard enough into the electrical outlets.
