There are two types of domestic wall outlets in use in the Dominican Republic: the ungrounded type A (NEMA 1-15) and the grounded type B (NEMA 5-15). The ungrounded type A plug has two flat parallel prongs. They are 1.5 mm

thick, measuring 15.9 – 18.3 mm in length and spaced 12.7 mm apart. Type A.

Type B outlets also have a standard voltage of 110-120 volts and a frequency of 60 Hz. If your devices have three-pronged plugs or require grounding, you'll need to use a Type B adapter in the Dominican Republic. These adapters allow you to connect your devices to Type B power outlets safely.

What type of power socket is used in the Dominican Republic?

The power sockets in the Dominican Republic are of type A and B. The standard voltage is 110 V at a frequency of 60 Hz. Check your need for a

power plug (travel) adapter in the Dominican Republic.

What do Dominican Republic electrical outlets look like?

When you are going on a trip to the Dominican Republic, be sure to pack the appropriate travel plug adapter that fits the local sockets. But what do those electrical outlets look like?

In the Dominican Republic, types A & B are the official standard. All of North and Central America, including the Caribbean, use U.S. style plugs and outlets.
